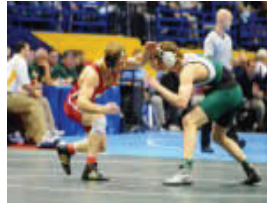

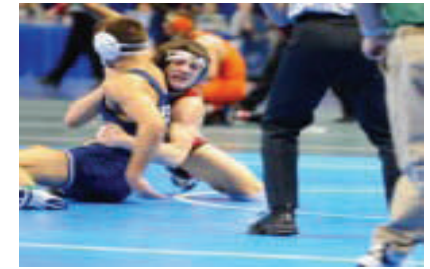

# Clinician Bios



**Craig Brester(Nebraska)**—2009 National Runner up after winning the Big 12 Championship. Brester was the outstanding wrestler at the 2009 Big 12 tourney. He also earned All-American honors in 2008 finishing 4th after a Big 12 runner-up finish. Brester was a 2007 National Qualifier posting a 2-2 mark after a Big 12 runner up finish. Key contributor to Nebraskas first Big 12 Championship in 2009. Brester has been in 3 straight Big 12 finals. **Before Nebraska**-Brester was a two-time state champion at Howells High School under Coach Lee Schroeder. Brester was a four-time state medalist and led Howells to a 2004 Class D state wrestling championship. He was 141-4 in his four-year wrestling career. He was also an all-state football player on a pair of state championship football teams at Howells and was an all-state performer.



**Brandon Browne(Nebraska)**—2008 and 2009 All-American earning fourth place honors both years. Browne was the Big 12 champion in 2008 and 2009 as well winning matches in the last seconds both years. Browne

posted a 30-5 record during his senior campaign to finish with a 79-15 career record. The mark put him seventh on NU's top 10 career win-loss percentage with a .840 mark. Key contributor on Nebraskas first Big 12 Championship team in 2009. Led the team in victories in 2008. **Before Nebraska**-Browne was an All-American and a two-time state champion at Plattsmouth High School for Coach Kyle Bluhm. Browne was a four-time state finalist at Plattsmouth, and wrestled to a career record of 138-6.



**Todd Meneely (UNO)**—Meneely is the 2008-09 NCAA Division II Wrestler of the Year after winning his third straight national championship this season. A three-time regional champion, Meneely captured the Division II national title at 149 pounds in 2007 and '08 before moving up to 157 this season and winning a third consecutive crown March 13-14 in Houston, Texas. He finished with an 85-5 career

record in three years with the Mavericks. Meneely was the driving force behind a UNO team that went undefeated in duals and ran away with the national team championship this season. He was named the Outstanding Wrestler at the NWCA Division II National Duals in January. **Before UNO**—One of the top prep wrestlers in Nebraska high school history...wrestling for class B powerhouse Omaha Skutt Catholic, he won four individual state titles...one of the only 13 wrestlers in Nebraska high school history to do so, his team also won four-straight Nebraska class B championships, had a 155-3 career record, 84-0 his junior and senior seasons, Freestyle and Greco Junior National Champion in 2002, named outstanding wrestler at Greco National Tournament, senior National runner-up, six-time junior National All-American, member of Cadet Freestyle world team



**Aaron Denson (UNO)**—Denson is a two time All-American finishing 7th as a freshman and as the runner up this past season. 2008 Denson was voted as the teams freshman on the year as he tied for the team high with 33 wins. 2007 Denson was named the teams redshirt of the year. Denson is poised to make a run at a National title the next two seasons. **Before UNO**—Won 3 Class A state titles, helped his team win

back-to-back Class A team championships, 155-7 for his four-year high-school career, placed second as a freshman, set Nebraska state records for career wins, won 33 career tournament championships, set state record with 36 pins in a season, USA wrestler All-American, ranked No.11 in the nation at 171 pounds by Wrestling USA magazine, 2005 Brute Adidas national champion in three events, Junior National Greco All-American, earned honorable mention all-state honors in football and was a two-time all-district selection, selected as Millard South's Scholar Athlete of the Year, selected as an All-American by USA Wrestling magazine.



**Josh Majerus (Chadron)**—Majerus wrapped up his career by finishing fourth at the 2009 NCAA Division II National Championships. It was the third straight year he claimed All-American honors. He has the second most wins in school history with a record of 117-43. Majerus, CSC's only

three-time All-American at the Division II level, was also named to the Division II National Wrestling Coaches Association All-Academic First Team at the conclusion of the national tournament. For the second consecutive year, Chadron State College's Josh Majerus has been named the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference's Academic Wrestler of the Year. He came out of nowhere as a sophomore in 2007 to finish second at 197 pounds at the NCAA Division II National Tournament and was the 2008 national event while finishing with a sparkling 37-3 record. Before Chadron--Had records of 32-9 and 37-4 his final two years at Boone Central while placing fifth and third at 189 pounds at the Nebraska State High School Tournament... Also was an all-district football player and ran the 800 for the track and field team... Was a member of the Nebraska wrestling team that participated in the Disney Duals and the Maine exchange programs in the summer of 2005.



**Brett Hunter (Chadron)**—Hunter, who is the school's all-time winningest wrestler with a 133-32 record, capped his career of with a 35-8 campaign winning his second national championship in 2009 to go along with his 2007 crown. Chadron Coach Ritzen calls Hunter "the complete package," noting that he has the physical skills, mental capacity and

work ethic that is required of a national champion. Red-shirted as a true freshman at CSC in 2004-05 when he had an 18-8 record at open tournaments... The next season, he went 31-11 and had 10 pins to lead the Eagles in victories and pins. Before Chadron--Had a 141-10 career record at Rushville High with half of the losses coming his freshman year... He was a four-time state tourney placer, finishing third as a freshman and a junior and winning the gold medal as a sophomore and a senior, when his record was 38-1... He pinned 91 of his career opponents.
